A peek at our Learning Experiences...

- Students will be learning how to communicate a message with color. This message will be aimed at inspiring their audience!
- Students will engage in an Eric Carle author study, looking in particular at his use of color to communicate a message. Students are making their own Eric Carle inspired art, using painting and collage techniques.
- Students will chase their curiosity through color inquiry stations. They will experiment with color mixing across a variety of mediums, create art, and investigate the color wheel.
- Students will create poetry as they learn to describe color. The kindergarten definition of poetry is "when you put your feelings into words".
- Students will be conducting an artist study on Dale Chihuly. Students will even explore different mediums as they emulate his work.
- Students will visit the Art Museum on the University of Michigan campus to observe how artists have used color to inspire and communicate. This is a wonderful trip that we look forward to.

Do you notice any spaces in your world that inspire you to feel a certain way? For example, noticing how a space with lots of green plants may make you feel energized or calm.

Look online at some famous artist's work and talk about what message you think the artist wanted to send with their color (Picasso is extra fun, since we will see his work on our field trip)!

After completing the study of color, kindergarteners will begin to explore how plants and animals (including humans) interact with weather cycles. Kindergarten meteorologists will use what they know about weather patterns to predict future weather!
